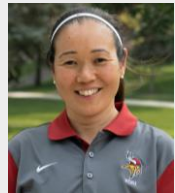
This webinar, is the first webinar in a series of four as part of "Introduction to GBAs" which are being released for the TGfU 40th Anniversary Year.

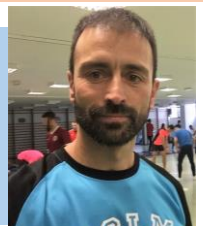

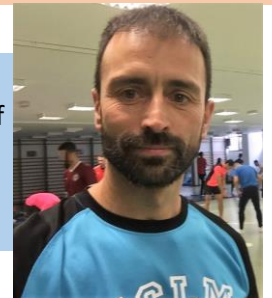
This webinar, is the concluding webinar in a series of four as part of "Introduction to GBA" which are being released for the TGfU 40th Anniversary Year.
